



Materials:

2 pieces of printer/copy paper (8 1/2 x 11) - scissors - needle and thread


- Step 1 Print this page as a 2-sided document. Cut out the cover.
- Step 2 Cut 1 piece of blank printer/copy paper into 4 equal quarters.



Step 3– Stack the four pieces with the cover on the bottom. Fold the stack in half. Use a smooth tool to flatten the fold.



Step 5- Thread the needle, any thread will do. Start from the *inside* of the pamphlet to sew the "pamphlet stitch." See diagram.



- **Step 6** Tie a square knot on the inside of the pamphlet. Make sure the long stitch is caught up between the two ends. See diagram.
- Step 7- Use a smooth tool to flatten the cover around the pages.
- Step 8- Write the date and your name or initials somewhere on the book!
